SECTION 4: First aid measures

4.1. Description of first aid measures

Common information: in all cases of doubt, or when symptoms persist, seek medical attention. In case of unconscious, do not give anything to drink or put anything in the mouth. Inhalation: There is no real risk in normal circumstances or in accidents. Non-volatile aqueous solution.

Skin Contact: Rinse skin with water.

Eye Contact: Rinse cautiously with water for several minutes. Remove contact lenses, if present and easy to do. Continue rinsing for at least 10 minutes occasionally lifting the upper and lower eyelids. If eye irritation persists: get medical advice/attention.

Ingestion: Rinse mouth and throat. Do NOT induce vomiting. Consult a physician.

4.2. Most important symptoms and effects, both acute and delayed:

Inhalation: No real risk.

If in eyes: May cause irritation, pain, tearing, eye redness.

If on skin: Prolonged usage may cause dry skin.

If swallowed: May cause irritation of stomach and intestines, cause abdominal pain, vomiting, diarrhea.

SECTION 5: Firefighting measures

5.1. Extinguishing media:

Suitable extinguishing media: must be selected assessing the burning properties of surrounding materials. The product is non-flammable.

5.2. Special hazards arising from the mixture: Not really from product itself.

5.3. Advice for firefighters:

Heating will cause rise in pressure with risk of bursting. Keep containers cool with water spray.

Special protective equipment for fire-fighters:

According to the size of the fire, it may be necessary to use protective suits against the heat, individual breathing equipment, gloves, protective goggles or facemasks, and boots.

SECTION 6: Accidental release measures

6.1. Personal precautions, protective equipment and emergency procedures:

Since the product is in small sealed packages, a major accident risk is not really. After large spill, ventilate area of leak. Avoid contact with skin and eyes. Evacuate all persons not involved in remedying emergency condition from hazardous area. Wear protective gloves. Stop or reduce any leaks if such action is safe. Ground floor may be slippery.

6.2. Environmental precautions: Do not allow of the large amounts released to drain systems or onto the soil.

6.3. Methods and material for containment and cleaning up: Collect leaked liquid in an appropriate container ex., from plastic, steel. Remainders absorb with textile, sand, sawdust, and place in a chemical waste container. Wash away remainder with water.
